Biographies



Dr. José Zozaya **Chairman, USMCOC**

José Zozaya has a Bachelor's Degree in Law from Universidad Iberoamericana and Postgraduate Studies in Corporate Law and Economic Competition from the Mexico Autonomous Institute of Technology (ITAM).

He was appointed President and Executive Representative for Kansas City Southern de México (KCSM) in April 2006. During his years in the railroad sector, he achieved significant achievements for the company and the industry in Mexico. Before becoming part of KCSM's executive team, he served as legal and government relations director for ExxonMobil Mexico for nine years. He was the National President of the American Chamber of Mexico for two terms from 2010 to 2012. He served as Vice President of the American Chamber of Mexico, the Association of American Chambers of Commerce in Latin America (AACCLA), and a Member of the Board of Afore Siglo XXI and Ferrovalle, SA de CV. In April 2013, he was appointed President of the Mexican Railroad Association (AMF). In November 2014, he was elected President of the Mexican Council of Transport (Consejo Mexicano del Transporte, CMET). In 2010, he received the Doctor Honoris Causa degree awarded by the Mexican Academy of International Law. He was granted the Guerrero Aguila 2010 award from the Coalition of Speakers, Poets, and Writers United for Mexico and the Chamber of Deputies. From August 2020 to March 2024, Zozaya served as Executive President of the Mexican Association of the Automotive Industry.



The Honorable Albert C. Zapanta **President and CEO USMCOC**

Albert C. Zapanta is President and CEO of the United States—Mexico Chamber of Commerce. He is responsible for operations in 19 regional offices in the United States and Mexico.

In the private sector, Mr. Zapanta was an executive with ARCO for 18 years. In public service, Mr. Zapanta has held a number of presidential appointments and was a member of the Department of State's Advisory Committee on International Trade, Technology and Development, and private sector delegate to the U.S.-Mexico Partnership for Prosperity.

General Zapanta's military record includes the award of the Silver Star, five Bronze Stars for Valor, the Purple Heart and thirty other awards during the Vietnam War. Mr. Zapanta was appointed by the Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia to the rank of Major General.

He currently serves on the boards of various non-profit organizations across the country. In June 2018, he was elected to serve on the Irving City Council and was reelected in 2021 and 2024. On May 2, 2026, he was elected Mayor with 67% of the vote. He and his wife Rochelle have two daughters, a son, and three grandchildren.

2026 Recipient Ambassadorial Recognition Award

Esteban Moctezuma Barragán has served as Mexico’s Ambassador to the United States since February 15, 2021, where he has focused on strengthening bilateral relations and fostering collaboration on key issues. Prior to this, he was Mexico’s Secretary of Public Education from 2018 to 2021, overseeing critical educational reforms aimed at improving access and quality. From 2002 to 2018, he served as President of Fundación Azteca, leading initiatives in education, culture, and environmental sustainability. Earlier, in 1998, he was appointed Secretary of Social Development, where he focused on poverty reduction and community development programs. Ambassador Moctezuma’s career reflects a lifelong commitment to advancing education, social welfare, and bilateral relations.



H.E. Ronald D. Johnson
Ambassador of the U.S. to Mexico
Honorary Chairman, USMCOC

Ronald Johnson was confirmed by the Senate as Ambassador to Mexico on April 9, 2025. He has served the United States government for over four decades, first as an officer in the U.S. Army, then as a member of the intelligence community, and most recently as the U.S. Ambassador to El Salvador. Among his various roles, Ambassador Johnson was the Central Intelligence Agency’s Science and Technology Liaison to the U.S. Special Operations Command, in Tampa, Florida. Prior to that, he was a Special Advisor to the U.S. Southern Command in Miami managing collaboration between the Command and the Intelligence Community. He worked on a wide range of regional issues including refugees, counter-narcotics, counter terrorism, human rights and tropical virus disease control. Ambassador Johnson has held various other assignments, including as the Deputy Special Advisor to the Commander, U.S. Special Operations Command (2006 – 2008), and as a senior operations officer at the CIA. Ambassador Johnson served in the U.S. Army from 1984 – 1998 and retired as a Colonel. He also served in the Alabama Army National Guard, enlisting as a private in 1971 and reaching the rank of Captain before going on to active duty in the Army in 1984. He is the recipient of numerous awards including an Honorary Doctor of Humanities from Williamson College, the Sue M. Cobb Award for Exemplary Diplomatic Service, and the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff – Joint Distinguished Civilian Service Award.

Ernesto Acevedo is Mexico’s Trade and Investment Attaché at the Embassy of Mexico in Washington, D.C., a position he assumed in December 2024. In this role, he represents the Ministry of Economy and leads efforts related to the implementation and review of the United States–Mexico–Canada Agreement (USMCA).

Previously, Mr. Acevedo served as Executive Director at the World Bank Group, representing Mexico, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, and Spain, following his role as Alternate Executive Director. He has more than 25 years of experience in finance and economics across the public and private sectors.

Mr. Acevedo has held several senior leadership positions within Mexico’s government, including Undersecretary of Industry, Commerce and Competitiveness, Chief of Staff, and Chief Economist at the Ministry of Economy. At the Ministry of Finance and Public Credit, he served in key roles such as Director General of Productivity Analysis and Director of Macroeconomic Analysis. He holds a Bachelor’s degree in Economics from the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM), a Master of Science in Economics from El Colegio de México, and completed doctoral studies in Economics, Finance, and Business at Universitat Pompeu Fabra in Barcelona.

Mario Cordero
Former CEO, Port of Long Beach

Mario Cordero is the former Chief Executive Officer of the Port of Long Beach, where he led one of the nation’s busiest and most complex seaports. Appointed in 2017, he was responsible for strategic planning, operational performance, financial oversight and environmental stewardship, managing a Harbor Department staff of more than 500 and a \$761 million annual budget.

An accomplished maritime industry leader and attorney, Mr. Cordero brought decades of public- and private-sector experience to the role. He previously served as President and Vice President of the Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners and as Chairman of the Federal Maritime Commission, the federal agency responsible for regulating international ocean transportation and protecting fair trade practices. During his tenure, he strengthened relationships with ocean carriers, terminal operators and global trade partners, advanced sustainability initiatives including the nationally recognized Green Port Policy, and expanded community engagement efforts. His leadership emphasized collaboration, inclusiveness and long-term economic and environmental resilience.

Greg Winfree **Agency Director & CEO, Texas A&M Transportation Institute**

Mr. Greg Winfree was appointed Agency Director of the Texas A&M Transportation Institute (TTI) in December 2016. TTI is a state agency and the largest and most comprehensive higher education-affiliated transportation research institute in the United States, with \$126 million in research expenditures and about 700 employees. He is also an Adjunct Professor at the Texas A&M School of Law. Greg served for almost seven years at the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT), most recently as Assistant Secretary of Transportation overseeing the department’s research and technology agency. He is a member of the Presidential National Space-Based Positioning, Navigation, and Timing Advisory Board sponsored by NASA, the Texas Connected and Automated Vehicle Task Force, the Transportation Research Board AV Forum, and a board member on the International Advisory Board for Development of Smart Mobility Platform. A lifelong attorney, Greg previously served in the civil rights division of the U.S. Department of Justice. He received a Juris Doctor degree from Georgetown University and a Bachelor of Science degree from St. John’s University.



Milton De La Paz **Vice President Airline Relations Global Strategy and Development Dallas Fort Worth International Airport**

Milton De La Paz is Vice President of Airline Relations and Cargo Business Development at Dallas Fort Worth International Airport and directs the airport’s primary business goal to grow the core business of domestic and international passenger and cargo airline service. He also leads efforts to optimize business performance with all passenger and cargo airline partners at DFW. Milton is an accomplished senior commercial executive with more than 25 years of airline experience in the aviation and commercial airlines industry. He is responsible for the execution of DFW Airport’s short- and long-range new air service strategies and for the airport’s strategy to retain and grow existing airline service. He also leads DFW’s air cargo business development strategy including new air cargo route development initiatives, facilities and infrastructure assessment and DFW air cargo community engagement.

Luis is Executive Vice President of Intermodal at Grupo México Transportes, where he oversees intermodal sales operations across Mexico and Florida while driving strategic growth and service innovation. With a degree in Economics and an MBA from the Mexico Institute of Technology (ITAM), Luis began his career with Ferromex in 2010. Throughout his career, Luis has played a pivotal role in advancing intermodal services. As a Sales Executive, he led the launch of the Eagle Premium Service to Monterrey in partnership with Union Pacific Railroad, enabling Ferromex’s entry into the FAK intermodal market. He later managed Domestic and Cross-Border Intermodal operations, where he designed and implemented key services, including a strategic BNSF Railway connection through El Paso–Juárez to the Silao ramp in Guanajuato.

Luis has held progressive leadership roles, including AVP Intermodal for Ferromex and Ferrosur, and Vice President Intermodal for Florida East Coast Railway, where he managed domestic and international commercial teams. In his current role, he has strengthened strategic partnerships, notably enhancing collaboration between BNSF, J.B. Hunt, and GMXT through the launch of Quantum de México, a high-reliability service with 95% on-time performance.

Luis also serves as President of the Mexican Intermodal Association (AMTI) for the 2026–2028 term, representing a broad network of stakeholders across the intermodal logistics chain in Mexico.

Patricio is a seasoned aviation executive and former CEO of LAN Airlines, where he led the company’s successful restructuring and transformation into what is now LATAM Airlines, establishing a foundation for global operational excellence and profitability. He later held senior leadership roles at IATA, including Regional Vice President for Latin America and the Caribbean, where he contributed to key industry transformations that strengthened the region’s global aviation position.

As Founder of AeroNex LLC and CEO of AeroNex Cargo, Patricio advises airlines, airports, and governments and delivers turnkey cargo solutions, including a long-term partnership with JetBlue. He also serves on multiple boards, is a Director of the Chile–U.S. Chamber of Commerce, and is President of the Federation of Binational Chambers of Commerce in the USA (FEBICHAM USA).

Robert Perez **Founder and CEO, P4 Partners, and former Deputy** **Commissioner of U.S. Customs and Border Protection**

Robert E. Perez is the Founder and CEO of P4 Partners and a former Deputy Commissioner of U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP). In this role, he led over 60,000 employees and managed a \$15 billion budget, overseeing CBP’s operations across U.S. borders and in 50 countries worldwide.

He held key leadership positions as Executive Assistant Commissioner for Operations Support and Director of Field Operations in both New York and Detroit. He was the founding Director of the Customs–Trade Partnership Against Terrorism (CTPAT). His work has earned him honors such as the “Distinguished Executive” award from the President of the United States and the “True American Hero” Lifetime Achievement Award.

Mr. Perez holds a degree in Economics from Rutgers University, is fluent in Spanish, and is a graduate of Harvard Kennedy School’s Senior Executive Fellows program.

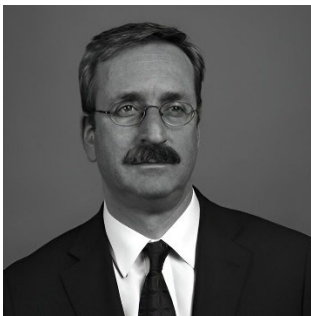


Joseph Guzman

Dr. Joseph Guzman serves as Associate Superintendent of Education, leading efforts in assessment, standards, accountability, and research. An economist and engineer, Dr. Guzman has held senior policy and executive roles within the Pentagon, including leadership positions with the Department of the Navy, Air Force, and the Department of Defense Biometric Management Office. His research background includes work with the Center for Naval Analyses and the RAND Corporation.

Dr. Guzman has been recognized with Civilian Service and Meritorious Service Medals from the Air Force and Army, as well as recognition from the National Institute of Standards and Technology for advancing biometric technologies. His education leadership includes serving two terms as an elected School Board Member in Virginia and as a Commissioner to the Education Commission of the States. He was also named Michigan Educator of the Year by the Michigan Civil Rights Board. He holds Engineering and MBA degrees from the University of Arizona, along with a PhD in Business Administration and advanced degrees in Economics, Statistics, and Business Research from Stanford University.

In his role, Mr. Eisner leads strategic initiatives focused on optimizing asset performance through collaboration across geoscience, engineering, and business functions. His experience includes private investment activities in Mexico and the Gulf of Mexico, where he successfully identified and developed profitable opportunities. Prior to joining MPC, he held senior leadership roles at several major energy companies, including CNOOC-Nexen, Apache Corporation, Repsol USA, BHP Billiton, and Anadarko Petroleum. Throughout his career, he has contributed to major global discoveries, including approximately 7 billion barrels of oil in Algeria. He also co-founded Petróleos Ebano, assembling and leading multidisciplinary teams for oil and gas investments in Mexico, and led geoscience efforts at Lifting-Cotemar to enhance asset valuation through integrated analysis.

Steve Menzies is a lifelong entrepreneur and Chief Executive Officer, best known for founding Applied Underwriters and North American Casualty Company, global firms specializing in insurance, reinsurance, and risk solutions. He has led the development of a top-rated U.S. insurer serving tens of thousands of employers and employees, achieving an AM Best A+ rating.

Menzies previously partnered with Berkshire Hathaway, where he became one of the youngest CEOs in the organization before successfully repurchasing his company in 2019. He is recognized for driving innovation in the insurance industry, including pioneering direct-to-claimant pharmacy solutions to better manage opioid use and improve care for injured workers.

Beyond his corporate leadership, Menzies is committed to community development and philanthropy. He is leading the creation of Heartwood Preserve, a large-scale mixed-use development in Omaha, Nebraska, and supports global initiatives through the Steve Menzies Global Foundation, focusing on social challenges such as criminal justice reform and wrongful detention.

She co-founded the company with her husband, Dick Uihlein, in 1980 and has guided its growth into a multi-billion-dollar enterprise with over 9,000 employees and a broad network of distribution centers across the U.S., Mexico, and Canada. She leads the company's strategic direction, merchandising, and customer experience, driving product expansion to more than 40,000 items and maintaining a strong focus on service excellence.

In addition, Liz oversees EAU Holdings, supporting hospitality and retail businesses in Wisconsin, and is actively involved in conservation efforts promoting outdoor preservation in Wisconsin and Illinois. Hon. María Teresa Jiménez

Governor of the State of Aguascalientes

María Teresa “Tere” Jiménez Esquivel is the Constitutional Governor of the State of Aguascalientes and the first woman to hold this office. A member of the National Action Party (PAN) since the age of 18, she has served in leadership roles within the party at both national and state levels, including Secretary of Education and Training. She has held key public positions across federal, state, and municipal governments, building a career focused on municipal strengthening and federalism. She served as a Representative in Mexico’s Chamber of Deputies. In 2017, she was elected Municipal President of Aguascalientes and re-elected in 2019. During her administration, she led efforts to modernize public services, including upgrading public lighting, streamlining municipal procedures, and implementing technology to improve public safety and emergency response. Following her mayoral term, she returned to Congress before winning the 2022 gubernatorial election. She assumed office on October 1, 2022. Governor Jiménez holds a degree in Political Science and Public Administration, two master’s degrees in Public Policy and Public Management, and a doctorate in Constitutional, Criminal, and Amparo Law, with expertise in public policy, electoral law, and gender equity.



Amb. Christopher Landau

U.S. Deputy Secretary of State

Former Ambassador of the U.S. to Mexico

Christopher Landau was sworn in as the 23rd Deputy Secretary of State on March 25, 2025. In this role, he supports the Department’s global diplomatic efforts, drawing on his experience in international relations, law, and public service.

Deputy Secretary Landau previously served as United States Ambassador to Mexico from 2019 to 2021, where he led the nation’s largest diplomatic mission and strengthened bilateral cooperation. His tenure contributed to major achievements, including the implementation of the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement, the protection of cross-border commerce during the pandemic, and a significant reduction in illegal migration.

Before and after his diplomatic service, he spent over three decades practicing law in Washington, D.C., focusing on appellate litigation. He has argued cases before the U.S. Supreme Court and federal appellate courts across a wide range of legal issues.

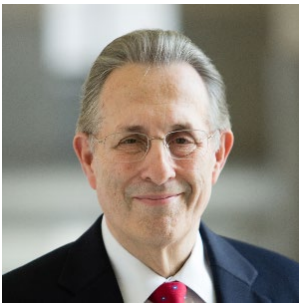

Esteban Moctezuma Barragán has served as Mexico’s Ambassador to the United States since February 15, 2021, where he has focused on strengthening bilateral relations and fostering collaboration on key issues. Prior to this, he was Mexico’s Secretary of Public Education from 2018 to 2021, overseeing critical educational reforms aimed at improving access and quality. From 2002 to 2018, he served as President of Fundación Azteca, leading initiatives in education, culture, and environmental sustainability. Earlier, in 1998, he was appointed Secretary of Social Development, where he focused on poverty reduction and community development programs. Ambassador Moctezuma’s career reflects a lifelong commitment to advancing education, social welfare, and bilateral relations.

Ambassador Earl Anthony Wayne is a distinguished diplomat and executive with extensive experience in global policy and international relations. He served in senior roles including U.S. Ambassador to Mexico and Argentina, Deputy Ambassador in Afghanistan, and Assistant Secretary of State for Economic and Business Affairs. He concluded his government service with the rank of Career Ambassador, the highest in the U.S. Foreign Service.

Wayne has led large, complex teams in Washington and abroad, shaping policy across economic, political, security, and public diplomacy issues. He currently serves as a Distinguished Diplomat in Residence and Professorial Lecturer at American University, while also advising leading organizations such as the Atlantic Council and Inter-American Dialogue.

Following his diplomatic career, Wayne remains active as a speaker, writer, and advisor on international affairs, with expertise in North America, trade, and security. He has received numerous honors and holds degrees from Harvard, Princeton, Stanford, and the University of California, Berkeley.
